Dates and Times:

April 11th 2011:

10:00 am: Alfalfa County, 1.5 miles east of Burlington, turn south then take first drive on the west.

2:00 pm: Kingfisher County, 7.5 miles west of Hwy 81 & 33 intersection in Kingfisher then 3 miles south. 5:00 pm: Canadian County, In El Reno go east of Hwy 81 & 66 intersection then turn north on Spur Lane.

April 12th 2011:

9:00 am: Harmon/Jackson County, 5 miles west of Duke, OK. North side of road. Plots north of the road.

1:00 pm: Comanche County, NE corner of Lee Blvd. and Sheridan in Lawton, OK.

3:00 pm: Cotton County, 8 miles west of Walters, OK then 4.75 miles south. Plots are east of the road.

6:00 pm: Stephens County, 3 miles west of Comanche, OK then 3 miles south. Plots are west of the road.

April 13th 2011:

9:00 am: Noble County, 5 miles east of Perry, OK, 2 miles south, then 0.75 miles east. Plots south of road.

1:00 pm: Oklahoma County, 1.5 miles south of I40 and Council Rd in OKC, OK then east 0.25 mile.

4:00 pm: Grady County, OSU South Central Research Station in Chickasha, OK. Plots south of shop.

6:30 pm: Caddo County, OSU Caddo Research Station by Ft. Cobb Lake. Plots west of the road.

April 14th 2011:

9:00 am: Dewey County, On Hwy 47, go 9.5 miles west of Hwy 183. Plots on the north side of the road.

1:00 pm: Blaine County, 7 miles south of Okeene, OK then 1 mile west. Plots on north side of road.

3:30 pm: Major County, 4 miles east of Fairview, OK. Plots are on the north side of the road.

6:30 pm: Garfield County, 4 miles west of Hunter, OK. Plots are on the north side of the road.
